### Learning this September!

As a brief outline, these are some of the areas of learning that your children will be developing this Autumn half term:

Class 1 - To settle our new children in, we are learning all about ourselves, our Autumn season and Harvest! In English, we are writing some little books about ourselves and in Science we are learning about our bodies and healthy eating. In Art, we will be mixing different colour paints to create paintings of special family members and Harvest fruit and vegetables.

Class 2 - It's all about World War 2 and the Blitz in Class 2, which the children learn in History. In Science, they'll be finding all about their bodies and what they can do. We will be finding out what Christians believe God is like and in Computing we will be practising our word processing skills.

Class 3 - Science in Class 3 is exploring materials and in History, we will be learning 'From the Stone Age to the Iron Age'. We are developing our drawing skills further in Art and will be doing block coding in Computing!

Class 4 - We are learning all about the Golden Age of Baghdad in History, in Science it's all about animals and living things, 'survival' in English and our class read is Crater Lake. In PE, we are doing tag rugby and fitness and some printing in art!

#### Wrap Around Care

This year, we are able to offer Wrap Around Care for your children, 8am -5:20pm. We are the only school in the area to do so.

**Breakfast club** starts at 8am and is ran by **Mr Robinson**. The children take part in a variety of activities, in a fun and relaxed

environment, with a continental style buffet breakfast to choose from (cereals, toast, brioches, juices, fruits, yogurts etc). A perfect start to the day! The cost for breakfast club is £3, bookable on Arbor.

Extended after school club runs from 3:20-5:20pm and is ran by Mrs Bridden. The club is focused on having fun, taking

part in an ever-changing selection of activities with time to chill and relax after a busy day too. The children help prepare

their own snack (sandwich, veg sticks, toasties etc) and will do activities such as baking, crafts, gardening, sports, computer games, painting and many more! The cost is £7.50 and is bookable on Arbor.
