Learning this term!

As a brief outline, these are some of the areas of learning that your children will be developing before Christmas:

Class 1 - Celebrations - Bonfire Night, Remembrance, Diwali and Christmas! We are reading books about farmyard animals and practising our ch, sh, th sounds.

Class 2 - Gunpowder plot, textiles, Judaism and Christmas story, Being Me, 'Rhythm in the way you walk', computer drawing and we are reading Flat Stanley.

Class 3 - The Roman Empire, drawing and proportion skills linked to Narnia, eating and digestion, The People of God and we are reading The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe.

Class 4 - Forces, renewable energy sources, sketching and drawing, gymnastics, mechanisms and we are reading Cosmic with a trip to the National Space Centre.

Parking

We know that parking is difficult around school, but we must stress that illegal or dangerous parking is not acceptable around the school area. We are working with the local council to find solutions moving forward, and we are exploring

options of a slightly staggered end time for some children to try and help with the issue. However, parking on the yellow schools lines is

strictly prohibited and causes obstructions, putting our children at risk of injury. Parking on blind bends is also against the Highway Code. A parking enforcement vehicle will begin patrolling the area. Please ensure you park in a way that doesn't cause danger or obstruction to others, even if it does

mean parking further away from school and walking that bit further.

We all want to keep our children and community as safe as we can, but we can only do this when we all work together.

Please ensure you are proactive in filling out your child's reading record whenever they read to recognize and celebrate their efforts!

A fact about reading that you may or may not know is:

"Children learn 4,000 to 12,000 words per year through reading."
