

Learning this term!

As a brief outline, these are some of the areas of learning that your children will be developing this half term:

Class 1 - Oo-arrr! The Pirates Are Coming to our classroom, in our new book of the same name. We will be reading the book and writing a letter pretending we are Tom. We are painting pirates and making box models of pirate ships. We will also be learning about seas and oceans and about what floats and sinks in Science. In RE, we are learning about the Easter story and using our ball skills in PE.

Class 2 - Class 2 are continuing reading The Dragon Machine - will we read the ending soon...?! We will be writing our own adventure story about George. We will be investigating, designing and making a fruit salad in DT, linked to our Science question "How d<mark>o we</mark> stay <mark>health</mark>y?". Yum! In Geography, we will be exploring what we would find in a city, and will be thinking a<mark>bout J</mark>esus' crucifixion in RE and why it is important he came back to life. In PE, we are learning net and wall games, as well as fundamental skills. Class 3 - Mummies, pyramids, hieroglyphics... It's time to discover all about Ancient Egypt in History! In Science, we will be exploring what we can learn from fossils and in RE, we are thinking about the creation story and its importance to Christians. Our book is Koji's Island and we will be writing adventure stories on our own islands. In DT, we will be designing and making mechanisms for a moving mascot! Class 4 - We are travelling all over in our learning this half term - exploring America and locational features in Geography, finding out about Darwin in the past from our book 'Islands' to write our own explanation text and going right back to Jesus' resurrection in RE to explore what a difference it made.

In DT, we will be making and adapting recipes to create our own biscuits and in Science we are answer-

ing the question "How do we see?". In PE, we are focusing on football and yoga.
