### **Building Renovations and Improvements!**

Over the Easter holidays, we will be having a number of different renovations completed around school. All the children's toilets (both juniors and infants) will be completely replaced and refurbished, Class 4 are having a new wall built, Classes 1 and 3 are having new blinds and a large cupboard is being converted in to an intervention room. Very exciting plans to help improve and modernise our school - we look forward to sharing pictures!

#### Teaching Improvements

We are totally dedicated to trying to provide the best, highest quality education we can for your children here at Laughton All Saints' and are constantly refining and improving our practice to ensure this is possible. We aim to keep you as informed as possible about these. This term, we

- Introduced a new spelling scheme for KS2, including home practice
- Re-designed our Science and Geography curriculum to provide long-term and exciting learning units from FS2 Y6
- Retrained on and refined the way we teach Early Reading and Phonics
- ♦ Started using the White Rose scheme for teaching Maths and mastery

### Learning this term!

As a brief outline, these are some of the areas of learning that your children will be developing this half term:

Class 1 - It's all about growing and hunting for minibeasts this half term! We will be growing sunflowers and learning how they grow, watching caterpillers and frogspawn grow, hunting for minibeasts outside and starting to learn about life cycles. In RE, we will learn about Easter celebrations and in Art we will be painting. Our author of the term is Sheridan Cain and we'll be writing 'What am I?' poems.

Class 2 - In DT, we are learning about preparing fruit and vegetables to create our own dip whilst in Science we will study plants and how they grow - we're even going to plant some seeds outside! We will be learning word processing skills and reading stories about Moses in RE. There'll be 'round and round' music being listened to and practiced, and in Maths we are learning about length, height and division.

Class 3 - We are going back in time to the industrial revolution and how the Steel City became famous, and finding out in Science at how humans have explored space! We are learning more about Easter in RE and tasting, designing and making our own salad in DT. Our book this term is 'The Lost Words' so we will be reading and writing poetry, whilst in Maths we are multiplying and dividing using formal methods. There'll be plenty of fitness and dodgeball in PE!

Class 4 - This half term's learning is learning about rocks and the rock cycle in Science and migration and why people move in Geography. In DT, we are investgating, tasting, designing and making some seasonal soups (yum yum!) whilst in RE we will be exploring salvation, along with our own hopes and dreams in PSHE. In English, we are continuing with our book 'The Explorer' and writing narratives and biographies. Maths will be lots of reasoning and applying of our knowledge, with a focus on time and percentages, all finished off with some dodgeball and orienteering in PE!

#### Read, Read and Read again!

Please, please, please ensure you are reading as much as you can with your children, or encouraging them to read as often as possible. It is so important that they re-read books as well. We ask that they try to read at least 5 times per week at home with as many of these as possible to an adult. Reading has the biggest impact on a child's abilities and we cannot stress how important it is for your child to read regularly. Please ensure you are proactive in filling out your child's new reading diary whenever they read to recognise and celebrate their efforts! The more reads they do, the more certificates they'll earn!

A fact about reading that you may or may not know is:

"Reading exercises our brain. It's a much more complex task for the human brain than watching TV. Reading strengthens brains connections and builds NEW connections."



### Thursday 7th April 9:15am


Parents and families are invited to join us in our celebrations which will be led by Rev Mike. We look forward to seeing you there!
