Transition

As we move through this half term, there are some key dates for transition that you will need to be aware of:

Read, Read and Read again

Please, please, please ensure you are reading as much as you can with your children, or encouraging them to read as often as possible. It is so important that they re-read books as well. We ask that they try to read at least 5 times per week at home with as many of these as possible to an adult. Reading has the biggest impact on a child's abilities and we cannot stress how important it is for your child to read regularly. Please ensure you are proactive in filling out your child's new reading diary whenever they read to recognise and celebrate their efforts! The more reads they do, the more certificates they'll earn!

A fact about reading that you may or may not know is: "Reading for just 6 minutes a day reduces stress by 68%."

We invite all parents and family members to join us on 5th July at 1pm on the school field for our annual Sports Day event. There will be lots of sports activities for your children to join in with, both for enjoyment and competitively, and children will compete in their houses to win as many points as they can!

We have also arranged for a very special person to join us... The MAYOR of Rotherham and his wife will be attending little Laughton's sports event with us!! We are very excited and blessed to be joined by his company and it will be a treat for children to welcome him to our school. Often a small school can get forgotten about, but not this one!



Learning this term!

As a brief outline, these are some of the areas of learning that your children will be developing this half term:

Class 1 - This term is all about traditional tales; Goldilocks and the Three Bears, Jack in the Beanstalk, the Ginerbread Man and Shrek! We will be building castles in DT so we can save locked away princesses and learning in Science the question "What are things made out of?" to explore different materials. Our author of the term is Hans Christian Anderson and we are learning all about the Creation Story in RE. We will be learning new gymnastic skills and moves in PE, and learning games ready for Sports Day!

Class 2 - In Class 2, we are doing lots of practical learning this half term! We will be learning about wheels and axles in DT to make our own moving vehicle, which helps us in Science because we are learning all about materials and which materials to choose. Our question for Geography is 'What is it like in Africa?' and in RE we are exploring our questions about God and finding out answers. Our story is 'Fantastic Mr Fox' and in Maths we are learning all about time and statistics.

Class 3 - Our class novel is 'The Legend of Podkin One Ear', a mythical story about a brave rabbit on a quest to defeat the enemy! In English we are reading 'The Tin Forest' and will be writing in role and letter writing. We are designing and building our own shell structures in DT to 'banish broken biscuits' for the Queen, and in Science we are investigating how our bodies keep us moving. 'What is the land-scape like in Sheffield' is our enquiry question in Geography and we will be going on a fieldtrip at the end of the year to find out more and in RE we are finding out about the Christian and Hindu answers to the big questions in life.

Class 4 - In English, we will be writing play scripts based around our class novel, Room 13 by Robert Swindells - a spooky story set in Whitby. In maths, we will be doing more work on fractions, decimals and percentages and embedding our learning through lots of problem solving. In Design and Technology, we will be using electrical systems to design and make moving fairground rides. In PE, we will be completing a unit of dance and playing team games to consolidate the skills in those we have learned over the year. In RE, we will be asking, 'How can following God bring freedom and justice?' whilst in geography, we will be studying moorlands and finding out why rivers are so important. Music will have a focus on appreciating classical music such as Beethoven, and following sequences of notes using instruments. In science, we will be exploring changes in materials.
